South Carolina All-State Team Guidelines

Target Year – Begins September 1 and runs through August 31

The requirements for the first team will consist of the five (5) shooters with the highest combined overall average in singles, handicap and doubles. The shooter having the highest all around average of the five (5) will be named captain of the South Carolina All-State Team. The target requirements are as follows:

- 1. Registered Singles Targets 2,000
- 2. Registered Handicap Targets 1,500
- 3. Registered Doubles Targets 1,000

Average Formula used to determine the team will be:

Total Number of Targets Hits/ Total Number of Targets Shot = Overall Average

In addition, any shooter qualifying for the All-State Team will be required to shoot the 400 state championship targets thrown at the South Carolina State Shoot. The 400 championship targets are as follows:

- 1. 200 State Singles Targets
- 2. 100 State Handicap Targets
- 3. 50 Pair State Doubles Targets

The 200 State singles targets are thrown on Saturday of the State Shoot. The 100 State handicap and the 50 pair of State doubles are thrown on Sunday of the State Shoot.

If for any legitimate reason a South Carolina shooter is unable to shoot the 400 state championship targets or any portion thereof at the State Shoot, that shooter will be required to shoot 400 championship targets at two (2) or more ATA Championship events.

If a South Carolina shooter does not shoot the 400 state championship targets during the South Carolina State Shoot, he or she must submit in writing the reason they did not compete within thirty (30) days of the last day of the South Carolina State Shoot. This letter may be submitted to any officer or director of the South

Carolina Trapshooting Association. This governing body will decide if requirements are met for qualification to State Team.

The officers and directors will also select category shooters as follows: one (1) Lady 1, one (1) Lady 2, one (1) Sub-Vet, one (1) Vet, one (1) Senior Vet, one (1) Sub-Junior, one (1) Junior and one (1) Junior Gold to the all-state team if target requirements and the other requirements mentioned above are met.

Any South Carolina category shooter mentioned above may qualify for the All-State First Team if all requirements including First Team target requirements are met.

Five (5) Honorable Mentions (Second Team) will consist of shooters not qualifying for the All-State First team or category shooters but who had the next highest overall average and met all of the requirements for All-State team mentioned above. One (1) shooter will also be recognized for the highest number of targets shot during the target year.

Recipients of all-state team recognition along with honorable mentions (second team) and highest number of targets winner will be recognized and awards given at the South Carolina State Shoot.
